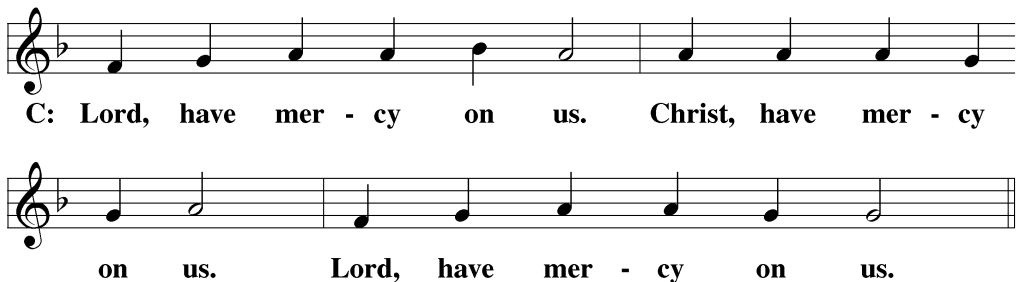
## CONFESSION OF SINS

## THE SECOND LESSON: I CORINTHIANS 1:26-31

*This Lesson serves as the Sermon Text for today.*

Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. <sup>27</sup>But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. <sup>28</sup>God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, <sup>29</sup>so that no one may boast before him. <sup>30</sup>It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. <sup>31</sup>Therefore, as it is written: “Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord.”

*In the Beatitudes, our Savior calls blessed people that the world would use as doormats! To live this kind of blessedness requires a deep trust in the Lord's Strength and a long-term view of life.*

they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

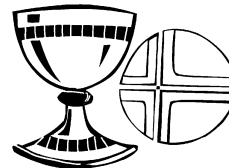

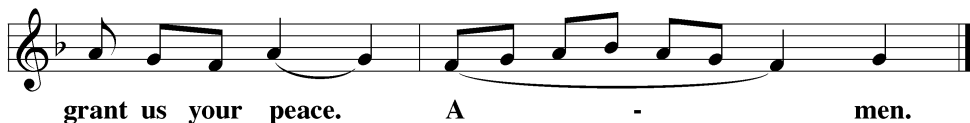


