(The name of the triune God and the sign of the cross remind worshipers of their baptisms.)


- M: In the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.




THE SECOND LESSON: GALATIANS 3:23-29

Paul contrasts the harsh imprisonment of the law with the gracious freedom of the gospel that comes through faith. In this contrast we see how the Lord can use the trails of the life and temptations of the heart to build deeper appreciation for his gracious salvation in Jesus Christ.

Before the coming of this faith, we were held in custody under the law, locked up until the faith that was to come would be revealed. ²⁴So the law was our guardian until Christ came that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵Now that this faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian.


²⁶So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, ²⁷for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

THE GOSPEL LESSON: LUKE 9:18-24

To all who confess Jesus as Lord and Savior come trials and suffering on account of his name. But to him who overcomes is given the crown of eternal life.

Once when Jesus was praying in private and his disciples were with him, he asked them, "Who do the crowds say I am?"

¹⁹They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, that one of the prophets of long ago has come back to life."

²¹Jesus strictly warned them not to tell this to anyone. ²²And he said, "The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life."

²³Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.²⁴For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it.

SERMON TEXT: ZECHARIAH 13:7-9

- C: Show yourself to them a very present help in time of need, giving them wisdom and understanding, wholeness of mind and body, courage and hope.


