The life, death, and resurrection of his Son has solved the problem. By trusting what Jesus has done for us, heaven awaits us and we live life this side of heaven in loyal thanks for rescue.

INVITATION TO WORSHIP

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

DIALOGUE OF PRAISE

M: Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord, let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation.

C: O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth. You have set your glory above the Heavens.

M: Give thanks to the Lord of lords, to him who alone does great wonders, who by his understanding made the heavens, who spread out the earth upon the waters, who made the great lights – the sun, to govern the day, the moon and stars to govern the night.

C: Great is the Lord and mighty in power; his understanding has no limit.

C: From the rising of the sun to the place where it sets, the name of the Lord is to be praised.

M: Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord.

C: Let the name of the Lord be praised forever and ever. Alleluia!

M: O loving God, you once caused this holy night to shine with the brightness of the true Light. May the words of Scripture we hear tonight remind us again that the old story is ever so new. May the carols we sing tonight reveal to us again the mystery of his birth. May the candles we see tonight symbolize for us your Son as the Light of the world. May all who have known that Light on earth come to the full measure of its joys in heaven.

C: Help us, O Lord, in our worship this night. Amen.

THE WORD OF GOD



THE FIRST LESSON: ISAIAH 9:2-7

Isaiah shares beautiful words of comfort for God's people. The darkness of sin will be scattered and the light of salvation will dawn. We celebrate tonight that God accomplished this in Jesus our Savior.

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light;

on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned.

³You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy;

they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest,

as warriors rejoice when dividing the plunder.

⁴For as in the day of Midian's defeat,

you have shattered the yoke that burdens them,

the bar across their shoulders,

the rod of their oppressor.

⁵Every warrior's boot used in battle and every garment rolled in blood

will be destined for burning,

will be fuel for the fire.

⁶For to us a child is born,

to us a son is given,

and the government will be on his shoulders.

And he will be called

Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father,
Prince of Peace.



⁷Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end.

He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom,

establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever.

The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this.

THE SECOND LESSON: TITUS 2:11-14

In the Christ-child, God revealed his grace to all people and changed our eternal destiny.

For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people. ¹²It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, ¹³while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, ¹⁴who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good.

THE GOSPEL LESSON: LUKE 2:1-20

The Savior has come and his light shines brightly in the darkness.

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ²(This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³And everyone went to their own town to register.

⁴So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. ⁶While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, ⁷and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

⁸And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. ⁹An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹²This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

¹³Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven,


and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

¹⁶So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. ²⁰The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

THE CANDLELIGHTING CEREMONY

(The minister will light his candle from the Christ candle. He will give light to the ushers, who in turn will give light to the first worshiper in each pew, who will then pass it on to the others. Please do not tip the lighted candle, but always hold it upright when giving light to another.)

(After all the candles have been lit, we join in the responsive reading.)

- M: "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned."
- C: Jesus is the Light of the World. Whoever follows him will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.
- M: Jesus came into the world as a light, so that no one who believes in him will stay in darkness.
- C: The true light that gives light to every man has come into the world.

M: Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.(John 14:27)"

C: "I have told you these things so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world! (John 16:33)"

PRAYER

M: When all was still and it was midnight, your eternal Word, O Lord, descended from the almighty throne to dwell among us. THE SEASON OF CHRISTMAS

For over two thousand years the Christian world has marked the passing of time from the year of Jesus birth. Recognizing his coming into the world as the central event in the story of humankind, Christians count the years before his birth as B.C. (Before Christ) and the years after his birth as A.D. (Anno Domini, the Year of our Lord.)

An event so important wasn't just celebrated for a day or two. Early Christians would celebrate Christmas for twelve days. (You are perhaps familiar with the song The Twelve Days of Christmas). Our celebration of Christ's birth will follow that ancient pattern. Here are other opportunities to worship in this Christmas season:

Wednesday, December 25 at 10:00 a.m.—The Festival of the Nativity—In a celebratory service, we gather on Christmas day to celebrate Christ's birth with a service of lessons and carols.

Sunday, December 29 at 8:00 & 10:30 a.m.—We gather to thank God for the year that has gone by and to ask for his blessings on the year before us. We give praise to God that in all things we know that he cares for us.
