¹ The Invocation, which uses the words spoken over us at our baptisms, remind us of who we are (children of God) and what we are members of—the church of God on earth.


² This hymn of confession is based on the words of the prophet Isaiah when he was called by God. In this confession, we contemplate why we do the sinful things we do; but also, in line with Romans 10:13, we are reminded that the believer's plea for forgiveness never goes unheard. Righteousness, forgiveness, and holiness all come from outside ourselves – that is, from our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Warnings ignored, I had thought I was stronger Till walls of shame rose around me. How can you call me your child any longer? Guilt and despondency hound me. *refrain*

Look where I've gone to forget my condition Places which you have forbidden. Bring to my soul true remorse and contrition. Show me your face; don't stay hidden. *refrain*

- What can I do with you, Ephraim? What can I do with you, Judah? Your love is like the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears.
- Therefore I cut you in pieces with my prophets, I killed you with the words of my mouth; my judgments flashed like lightning upon you.
- For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings.

SECOND LESSON: ROMANS 4:18-25 4


¹⁸ Against all hope, Abraham in hope believed and so became the father of many nations, just as it had been said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

Without weakening in his faith, he faced the fact that his body was as good as dead—since he was about a hundred years old—and that Sarah's womb was also dead. ²⁰ Yet he did not waver through unbelief regarding the promise of God, but was strengthened in his faith and gave glory to God, ²¹ being fully persuaded that God had power to do what he had promised. ²² This is why "it was credited to him as righteousness." ²³ The words "it was credited to him" were written not for him alone, ²⁴ but also for us, to whom God will credit righteousness—for us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead. ²⁵ He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our justification.

VERSE OF THE DAY

2 Corinthians 5:19

P: Alleluia. God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Alleluia.



⁴ This is the second of sixteen lessons from book of Romans (Pentecost 2-17). How could God choose the ministers he did? How could God choose the people he did? How can God continue to love us after all the times we turn our back on him? Because of an alien ("outside ourselves") righteousness, long promised and now credited to us and to all who believe in him who raised Jesus from the dead.

GOSPEL LESSON: MATTHEW 9:9-13 5

⁹ As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him.

¹⁰ While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and "sinners" came and ate with him and his disciples. ¹¹ When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and 'sinners'?"


¹² On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. ¹³ But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."



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The call of Matthew manifests the mercy of God. The Pharisees knew the Scriptures and walked the walk. They left no sacrifice undone. Their outward righteousness and place of respect among the people were the mirror opposite of the man sitting in the tax collector's booth. Despised as a quisling and swindler, the publican's only companions were the other "sinners" who lived beyond the pale of Jewish Law. Yet the call of Christ to faith and apostleship did not come to these outwardly righteous Pharisees, but to the tax collector. So powerful was the call that Matthew left his station and his old life behind and followed. Jesus bypassed the Pharisees because they knew sacrifice but were blind to mercy. When they questioned Christ's acts of mercy, Jesus tells the teachers of Israel to go and learn Scripture, to see the difference between mercy and sacrifice...to see that their claims of righteousness were nothing but more whitewash on tombs. Can they really be healthy when they are blind to mercy for their brothers, blind to the prophets, and blind to the Messiah? Christ wanted different ministers than these. He wanted ministers who knew the mercy of God and would share the mercy of God. So he turned to the sinner, Matthew, and called him from his life of sin to a life of ministry with those merciful words, "Follow me."



ANNOUNCEMENTS

COVID Announcement: It recently came to our attention that a member of our Northdale Lutheran Church family has been diagnosed with COVID-19. This communication is to make you aware that this member was present at Bible class and 10:30 AM worship on Sunday, June 21. While the condition was unknown at the time, the first symptoms started to appear Sunday evening. A test confirmed the condition June 25. We want our church family who was present at Bible class and/or second service on June 21 to be aware of this situation and monitor their health for any COVID symptoms.

In response to this situation, your prayers are requested for our church family and you can be assured that the Northdale leadership is implementing a two-step process to mitigate the risk. The first step is to cancel in-person worship services on Sunday, June 28 and July 5. We will resume our 9:00 AM distance worship service schedule for these two Sundays. Due to the complications of our pastoral transition, we will be making use of another church's worship service video which will be shared on our Northdale Lutheran Church Facebook page and emailed using the Daily Devotion distribution list. You can expect the service video and worship folder to be posted each Sunday morning. There will not be an online Bible class June 28 or July 5. The second step has been to alert our cleaning service which will complete a deep cleaning June 26. They have been using a disinfecting fog in the church building each week along with their regular cleaning routine since we resumed inperson services. The disinfecting fog will continue to be part of the regular cleaning routine as long as necessary.

<u>Sunday Morning Bible Study:</u> We will not hold our regular Bible Study this morning or July 5. Instead, you are encouraged to make use of the Daily Devotion emails to participate in personal Bible study. We plan to resume in-person worship and Bible Study July 12.

<u>Vacancy Pastor & Worship Plan Update:</u> It had been announced this past Sunday that Pastor Bill Gabb would likely be serving as our vacancy pastor until a new pastor would accept our call to serve Northdale Lutheran. Due to some recent health issues, Pastor Gabb is no longer able to serve the role of vacancy pastor role. In the meantime, Pastor Nuss will be serving us God's Word when we resume in-person

worship on Sunday, July 12. We thank him for his service in this transition time. Plans past July 12 are in development and will be included in future announcements. Please keep Pastor Gabb, our congregation, and Pastor Nuss in your prayers during this time of transition.
