The Passion History Reading

(Taken from the 4 Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke, John)

JESUS BEFORE THE SANHEDRIN

While Jesus was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived, guiding a detachment of soldiers and some officials of the chief priests and Pharisees. They were carrying torches, lanterns, and weapons. With him was a large crowd armed with swords and clubs. Judas was leading them.

Jesus, knowing all that was going to happen to him, went out and asked them, "Who is it you want?"

"Jesus of Nazareth," they replied.

"I am he," Jesus said. Judas the traitor was standing there with them. When Jesus said, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground.

Again, he asked them, "Who is it you want?"


And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth."

"I told you that I am he," Jesus answered. "If you are looking for me, then let these men go." This happened so that the words he had spoken would be fulfilled: "I have not lost one of those you gave me."

Now the betrayer had arranged a signal with them. "The one I kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away." Going at once to Jesus, Judas approached Jesus to kiss him and said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" and kissed him.

Jesus asked him, "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss? Friend do what you came for."

Then the men stepped forward, seized Jesus, and arrested him. When Jesus' followers saw what was going to happen, they said, "Lord, should we strike with our



swords?" Simon Peter reached for his sword, drew it out and struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear. The servants name was Malchus. "No more of this! Put vour sword back into its sheath." Jesus said to him. "for all who draw the sword will die by the sword. Shall I not drink the cup my Father has given me to drink? Do vou think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels? But how then, would the Scriptures be fulfilled that sav it must happen in this way?" And Jesus touched the man's ear and healed him.

At that time Jesus said to the arresting crowd, "Am I leading a rebellion, that you have come out with swords and clubs to capture me? Every day I sat in the temple courts teaching, and you did not lay a hand on me. But this is your hour—when darkness reigns! This has all taken place that the words of the prophets might be fulfilled." All the disciples deserted him and fled.

Then the detachment of soldiers with its commander and the Jewish officials arrested Jesus. They bound him and took him away.

They brought Jesus to Annas, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, the high priest that year. Then they took him to Caiaphas, the high priest, where all the chief priests, elders, and teachers of the law had assembled. Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it would be good if one man died for the people.

Simon Peter and another disciple were following Jesus. Because this disciple was known to the high priest, he went with Jesus into the high priest's courtyard, but Peter had to wait outside at the door. Then the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, came back, spoke to the girl on duty there, and brought Peter in. It was cold, and the servants and officials stood around a fire they had made to keep warm. Peter entered and sat down with the guards to see the outcome.

One of the servant girls of the high priest on duty at the door came by. When she saw Peter seated there in the firelight warming himself, she looked closely at him and said, "You also were with that Nazarene, Jesus. Are you not one of this man's disciples?"

He replied, "Girl, I am not. I don't know him. I don't know or understand what you are talking about." Simon Peter went out into the entryway and the rooster crowed.

A little later, when the servant girl again saw him there, she said to those standing around, "This fellow is one of them."

Again, he denied it, this time with an oath, "I am not! I don't know the man!"

About an hour later, another asserted, "Certainly this fellow was with him, for he is a Galilean." Those standing there went up to Peter and said, "Surely you are one of them, for your accent gives you away." One of the high priest's servants, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, challenged him, "Didn't I see you with him in the olive grove?"

Then Peter began to call down curses upon himself, and swore to them, "I don't know the man you are talking about." Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. And the Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him: "Before the rooster crows today, you will disown me three times." And he went outside, broke down, and wept bitterly.

Now Annas had sent him still bound to Caiaphas, the high priest. The high priest questioned Jesus about his disciples and his teaching.

"I have spoken openly to the world," Jesus replied. "I always taught in the synagogues or at the temple. I have said nothing in secret. Why question me? Ask those who heard me. Surely they know what I said."

Then one of the officials nearby, struck him in the face. "Is that anyway to answer the high priest?" he demanded.

"If I said something wrong," Jesus replied, "speak up about it. But if I spoke the truth, why did you hit me?"

The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for evidence against Jesus so that they could put him to death, but they did not find any. Many testified falsely against him, but their statements did not agree.

Finally, two came forward and declared, "We heard him say, 'I am able to destroy the temple of God and rebuild it in three days. I will destroy this man-made temple and in

three days will build another, not made by man." Yet, even their testimony did not agree. Then the high priest stood up before them and asked Jesus, "Are you not going to answer? What is this testimony these men are bringing against you?" But Jesus remained silent and gave no answer.

Again, the high priest asked him, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed One? I charge you under oath by the living God: Tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God."

"I am," Jesus said, "It is as you say. But I say to all of you: In the future you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven."

Then the high priest tore his clothes and said, "he has spoken blasphemy! Why do we need any more witnesses? Look, you have heard the blasphemy. What do you think?"

"He is worthy of death," they answered.

Some began to spit on him. They blindfolded him, and struck him with their fists. Others slapped him and said, "Prophesy to us, Christ. Who hit you?" The men who were guarding Jesus began to mock and to beat him and to say many other insulting things to him.

The Lenten Greats

CW, #105 O Sacred Head, Now Wounded

This Lenten Great was written by Bernard of Clairvaux. He was born in France in 1091. He was the son of a very wealthy noble family. During his childhood, his father died in military battle and his mother died soon after, leaving him an orphan at age 14. He eventually would give up the secular life and became a monk in the Cistercian Order. At a young age he realized everything this world has to offer is fleeting and all life ends in death, but only in Christ is there hope and eternal life. He simply, gave up the world so that he could gain Christ.

Throughout the years he devoted himself to service in God's Church, writing sermons and hymns, and always standing for the truth of God's Word. Martin Luther would write about Bernard of Clairvaux, *"If there has ever been a pious monk who feared God, it was St. Bernard, whom alone I hold in much higher esteem than all other monks and priests throughout the world."*

In writing the hymn, O Scared Head Now Wounded, he pictures the great suffering and death Jesus endured for sinners. Bernard pictures himself before the cross and seeing Jesus suffer for his sin, seeing Jesus endure the punishment that should had been his own. He ultimately concluding, this world has no lasting value but only in Christ is there salvation, and then closing his hymn, "Who dies in faith dies well!"

SERMON TEXT: MARK 8: 31-38

He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. ³²He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

³³But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

³⁴Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. ³⁶What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? ³⁷Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? ³⁸If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels." Preferred Enrollment Period for Northdale Families

New for the 2021-2022 school year, NCA will be implementing a preferred enrollment period for current NCA families and members of Northdale Lutheran Church through February 28. Current families with siblings new to NCA need to complete the online application for enrollment prior to February 28 to qualify for preferred enrollment. The \$75 application fee will appear as a credit on your first tuition payment. The re-enrollment fee (K-8 only) will be \$400 per child through February 28. The fee will increase to \$500 March 1 and \$600 April 1. New family applications to NCA will be given enrollment opportunity starting March 1. 2021-2022 applications from families new to NCA are already being received. Current NCA families received an email from TADS with re-enrollment directions. The application for enrollment can be found on our website: NorthdaleChristianAcademy.org. Please speak with Mr. Mattes if you have any NCA enrollment questions.

Face Coverings for Worship

Last month the Ministry Leadership Team decided face coverings are required for the 8:00 AM service and Bible class at 9:25 AM. This requirement went into effect August 9. Children 7 years old and under are not required to wear face coverings. Face coverings will continue to be encouraged, but not required, for the 10:30 AM service. NLC will have disposable masks available for those who do not have their own. It is the intent of the MLT that this change would remove barriers which may exist for those who feel strongly about wearing masks while also presenting options for those who feel differently. We want our people to feel comfortable and safe while worshiping online or in-person.
