INVOCATION

(The name of the triune God and the sign of the cross remind worshipers of their baptisms.)

CONFESSION

M: God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to forgive us.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

ABSOLUTION

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

M: For the well-being of your holy Church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise, hear our prayer, O Lord.







The Passion History Reading

(Taken from the 4 Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke, John)

Jesus Condemned To Death

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. The soldiers led Jesus away into the palace of the governor, the Praetorium, and called together the whole company of soldiers. They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on his head, put a staff in his right hand and knelt down in front of him worshipping. They spit on him, struck him in



the face, and took the staff and struck him on the head again and again. They mocked him and began to call out to him, "Hail, King of the Jews!"

Once more Pilate came out and said to the Jews, "Look, I am bringing him out to you to let you know that I find no charges for a basis against him."

When Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe, Pilate said to them, "Here is the man!"

As soon as the chief priests and their officials saw him, they shouted, "Crucify! Crucify!"

But Pilate answered, "You take him and crucify him. As for me, I find no basis for a charge against him."

The Jews insisted, "We have a law, and according to that law he must die, because he claimed to be the Son of God."

When Pilate heard this, he was even more afraid,

and went back inside the palace. "Where do you come from?" he asked Jesus, but Jesus gave him no answer. "Do you refuse to speak to me?" Pilate said. "Don't you realize I have the power either to free you or to crucify you?"

Jesus answered, "You have no power over me that was not given to you by my Father in heaven. Therefore the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin."

From then on, Pilate tried to set Jesus free, but the Jews kept shouting, "If you let this man go, you are no friend of Caesar's. Anyone who claims to be a king opposes Caesar."

When Pilate heard this, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judge's seat at a place known as the stone pavement, which in Aramaic is Gabbatha. It was the Preparation of Passover Week, about the sixth hour.

"Here is your king," Pilate said to the Jews. But they shouted, "Take him away! Take him away! Crucify him!"

"Shall I crucify your king?" Pilate asked.

"We have no king but Caesar," the chief priests answered.

When Pilate saw that he was getting nowhere, but instead an uproar was starting, Pilate granted them their demand, wanting to satisfy the crowd. He took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. "I am innocent of this man's blood," he said. "It is your responsibility!"

All the people answered, "Let his blood be on us and on our children!"

Then Pilate released Barabbas to them, and had Jesus flogged. He then surrendered Jesus to their will to be crucified.

The soldiers of the governor took off the purple robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to be crucified. Carrying his own cross, he was led out to the place of the Skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. As they were going out they met a man from Cyrene, named Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus. He was passing by on his way in from the country. They seized him, and put the cross on him and made him carry it behind Jesus.

A large number of people followed Jesus, including women who mourned and wailed for him. Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. For the time will come when you will say, 'Blessed are the barren women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!" Then....

'They will say to the mountains: Fall on us!

And to the hills: Cover us!'

For if men do these things when the tree is green,
what will happen when it is dry?"

127 Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted

This Lenten Great was written by Thomas Kelly. Thomas Kelly was born in Ireland in 1769. His father was a judge in the city courts. Thomas also studied law for a time before becoming a pastor in the Church of Ireland. His study of secular law equipped him for a life of preaching God's law. However, his staunch preaching of God's law was met with opposition and he was banned from preaching in the State and Established Churches. He became an independent minister starting new churches around Ireland, places of worship where the Law of God was preached and places of worship where Christ the fulfillment of Law was preached.

Thomas Kelly knew where there was disobedience to God's Law, there must be punishment. But he also knew it was Christ, who took the punishment of God's Law upon himself. His hymn, Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted, calls our attention to "The reality of sin's cost." If we ever are tempted to think lightly of our sin, simply look to the cross of Jesus and see the reality of our sin and its punishment as it was carried out upon Jesus.

When Thomas Kelly was on his death bed, a friend bringing him comfort quoted to him Psalm 23, saying "The Lord is your Shepherd." To which Thomas replied, "The Lord is my everything."

Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the festival. ²¹They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. "Sir," they said, "we would like to see Jesus." ²²Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus. ²³Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. ²⁵Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me.

²⁷ "Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. ²⁸Father, glorify your name!"

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." ²⁹The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him.

³⁰Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. ³¹Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die. (NIV)






