
Restrooms are in the entrance and through the nursery hallway.

¹⁹My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires ²¹Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

²²Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.


²³Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

²⁶Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. ²⁷Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world. (NIV)

SERMON TEXT: MARK 7:31-37

In fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy, Jesus was the promised Savior who would come in greatest glory. Jesus would now display his glory in a miracle by healing a deaf man.


Then Jesus left the vicinity of Tyre and went through Sidon, down to the Sea of Galilee and into the region of the Decapolis. ³²There some people brought to him a man who was deaf and could hardly talk, and they begged Jesus to place his hand on him.

³³After he took him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spit and touched the man's tongue. ³⁴He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, "Ephphatha!" (which means "Be opened!"). ³⁵At this, the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosened and he began to speak plainly.

³⁶Jesus commanded them not to tell anyone. But the more he did so, the more they kept talking about it. ³⁷People were overwhelmed with amazement. "He has done everything well," they said. "He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." (NIV)

T Dear Brothers in Christ,
Below is an update from Pastor
Spiegelberg regarding the situation
in Louisiana following Hurricane Ida.
Included are the best ways that your
congregation can help at this point.

Yesterday we were able to make a run with limited supplies to our three churches there. All major roads are clear. There is extensive wind and water damage. There was no major damage to parsonages, churches or member homes. Power was still mostly out, however there were some members in Baton Rouge who had their power on already. The stop lights in Abita Springs were on when we left and apparently there are some spots in West New Orleans that are on as well. We are continuing to assess member and community needs.

We were able to drive across the Mississippi border and find gas stations open with lots of gas. There are some gas stations open in Baton Rouge and New Orleans but lines are very long.

Pastor Jon Kehl in New Orleans has indicated that there would be plenty of opportunities to help tarp houses around his area and general clean up. There would be use of volunteers as soon as this weekend on Friday, Saturday or Sunday. Another way to help would be for fuel, food, and monetary donations - crownoflifenola.com.

Pastor Schrimpf in Baton Rouge is still assessing clean up needs and is not ready to organize crews at this time. Immediate needs would be fuel, generators, water and cash - crossofglorylutheran.com

Pastor Patrick Freese and his family are living with me in Mobile currently. After looking at the needs in Abita Springs, he is working on how best to help the community there with the clearing of debris from downed trees and flooding, and general clean up-trinityabita.org.

We do not have a good assessment of the need for building materials. The challenge with work crews at this point is that whoever came would have to provide their own shelter, food and gas. Having said that, there are opportunities. It may be on a church-by-church basis and this will be developing in the days and weeks ahead.

The body of Christ is awesome.... And we are so blessed and thankful to be a part of our fellowship. I think of Pauls words... 1 Corinthians 1:4 I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus. We thank the Lord for your concern, generosity and love in Christ.
