Restrooms are in the entrance and through the nursery hallway.




- ♣ Handicapped accessible restroom facilities are located through the nursery hallway and back in the preschool area.

The First Lesson: Zephaniah 3:14-17

No matter what enemies the children of Israel faced, Zephaniah reminded them, our God is a mighty warrior who would defeat all their enemies and at the same time save them from punishment. Therefore in all things to: Sing! Shout! Be glad! Rejoice!

Sing, Daughter Zion; shout aloud, Israel! Be glad and rejoice with all your heart, Daughter Jerusalem! ¹⁵The Lord has taken away your punishment, he has turned back your enemy. 

Sermon Text: Matthew 11:2-11

When John, who was in prison, heard about the deeds of the Messiah, he sent his disciples ³to ask him, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we expect someone else?"
