

C(ongregtion): And also with you.


CONFESSION OF SINS

THE WORD OF GOD




THE FIRST LESSON: 2 CORINTHIANS 12:7B-10

The Lord in his wisdom had given the Apostle Paul a "thorn in his flesh" some kind of physical ailment or weakness. Whatever this perpetual weakness was, it reminded Paul of his own mortality and kept him focused on the grace of God. This physical weakness led him to boast in the power of Christ and not in his own strength.

Therefore, in order to keep me from becoming conceited, I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. 8Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. ¹⁰That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

THE SECOND LESSON: LUKE 6:17-26

In Luke's account of the Beatitudes, which are Jesus teaching of blessings and woes, Jesus reminds us the kingdom of heaven does not operate as the world operates. This world says "be rich, be proud, be selfish" but the Lord says "be poor is spirit, humble in faith, and be generous in love." Following the ways of the Lord bring eternal blessings.

He went down with them and stood on a level place. A large crowd of his disciples was there and a great number of people from all over Judea, from Jerusalem, and from the coastal region around Tyre and Sidon, ₁₈who had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases. Those troubled by impure spirits were cured, ¹⁹and the people all tried to touch him, because power was coming from him and healing them all.

²⁰Looking at his disciples, he said:

"Blessed are you who are poor,

for yours is the kingdom of God.

²¹ Blessed are you who hunger now,

for you will be satisfied.

Blessed are you who weep now,

for you will laugh.

²² Blessed are you when people hate you,

when they exclude you and insult you

and reject your name as evil,

because of the Son of Man.

for you will go hungry.






