THE FIRST LESSON: ISAIAH 42:1-4


In the Old Testament, Isaiah looked ahead and pictured the coming of Jesus. As Jesus came, he would not come for his own honor or glory, but would come in humility as a servant to redeem his people from sin. A prophecy that would be fulfilled on Palm Sunday.

"Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will bring justice to the nations. ²He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. ³A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; ⁴he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his teaching the islands will put their hope." (NIV)

Glory be to the Father and to the Son* and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning,* is now, and will be forever. Amen.



THE SECOND LESSON: PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11

As Jesus showed humility in his coming on Palm Sunday, the Apostle Paul now encourages us to imitate Christ's humility in our lives. It's all about living for and serving others in the way Christ loved and lived for us.

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: ⁶Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; ⁷rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death even death on a cross!

⁹Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
