
• Restrooms are in the entrance and through the nursery hallway.

C(ongregtion): And also with you.


Confession of Sins

The First Lesson: 1 Kings 19:19-21


As Elijah's prophetic ministry was coming to an end, the Lord would give him a successor in Elisha. In this section you see Elisha's commitment to the Lord's service, leaving everything behind to be a full-time servant in the Lord's kingdom. Thank the Lord for faithful men and women who give themselves to full-time service in God's church.

So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him. ²⁰Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. "Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye," he said, "and then I will come with you."

"Go back," Elijah replied. "What have I done to you?"

²¹So Elisha left him and went back. He took his yoke of oxen and slaughtered them. He burned the plowing equipment to cook the meat and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out to follow Elijah and became his servant.

The Second Lesson: Luke 9:51-62

In this section Jesus teaches his disciples about service for Christ. Not only were they to be patient in the face of unbelief, but also to live in humility considering the great ministry of souls the Lord was laying before them. Only in Christ do we find the devotion and strength to serve him.

As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem. ⁵²And he sent messengers on ahead, who went into a Samaritan village to get things ready for him; ⁵³but the people there did not welcome him, because he was heading for Jerusalem. ⁵⁴When the disciples James and John saw this, they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call fire down from heaven to destroy them?" ⁵⁵But Jesus turned and rebuked them. ⁵⁶Then he and his disciples went to another village.

⁵⁷As they were walking along the road, a man said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go."

⁵⁸Jesus replied, "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head."

⁵⁹He said to another man, "Follow me."

But he replied, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father."

⁶⁰Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

⁶¹Still another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family."

⁶²Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

Thank you for Christian friends, for their affection and their care.



Lead us in thankful living today and always. Amen.


Lord's Prayer
