

Forgive us for the grudges we hold against our neighbors and family, justifying it as "righteous anger."



The First Lesson: Hosea 3:1-5

Even though the nation of Israel had turned away in adultery worshipping false and pagan gods, yet the Lord was always faithful holding out his forgiveness and restoring his people back in love.


¹The Lord said to me, "Go, show your love to your wife again, though she is loved by another man and is an adulteress. Love her as the Lord loves the Israelites, though they turn to other gods and love the sacred raisin cakes."

Children's Devotion


At this time, we invite all our young people to come forward to hear a special message prepared just for them.

The Second Lesson: 2 Corinthians 2:5–11

After a man in the Corinthian church was admonished for a particular sin that had caused divisions in the church, hurt the faith of members, and hindered the ministry - he was called to repent of his sin. Now after the man repented, the church was having a hard forgiving him and didn't want to welcome him back in their midst. Paul reminds the Corinthians about Christ's forgiveness to each and every one of us. If Christ is able to forgive our many and varied sins against God, how can we not forgive those who come in repentance seeking the mercy of Christ.

⁵If anyone has caused grief, he has not so much grieved me as he has grieved all of you to some extent—not to put it too severely. ⁶The punishment inflicted on him by the majority is sufficient. ⁷Now instead, you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. ⁸I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your love for him. ⁹Another reason I wrote you was to see if you would stand the test and be obedient in everything. ¹⁰Anyone you forgive, I also forgive. And what I have forgiven—if there was anything to forgive—I have forgiven in the sight of Christ for your sake, ¹¹in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes.


³Then Jesus told them this parable: ⁴"Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? ⁵And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders ⁶and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' ⁷I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.

8"Or suppose a woman has ten silver coins and loses one. Doesn't she light a lamp, sweep the house and search carefully until she finds it? 9And when she finds it, she calls her friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost coin.' 10In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."
