Have mercy on us, Lord!


Spare us, forgive us, and restore us, according to your promises in Christ Jesus.

First Reading Genesis 8:15–22

The life of a Christian is one of continual thanks and praise to God for all his blessings. In this section, Noah had a reason to give thanks to God. The Lord had spared his family, preserved the animals of his creation, and brought them safely through the flood to dry ground. Noah built an altar of worship to the Lord, and the Lord reiterated his promises to his people.

¹⁵Then God said to Noah, ¹⁶"Come out of the ark, you and your wife and your sons and their wives. ¹⁷Bring out every kind of living creature that is with you—the birds, the animals, and all the creatures that move along the ground—so they can multiply on the earth and be fruitful and increase in number on it."


