
Words of Institution

THE WORD OF GOD*

The First Lesson: Genesis 32:22–30

Years earlier, Jacob had fled home after stealing from and deceiving his family. Now as Jacob is about to return home, he is filled with anxiousness and fear. It is the Lord who comes to Jacob in physical form so that through his wresting with God, Jacob would place his trust in the Lord. A reminder to us that the Lord is always in control of every circumstance and able to bring forth blessing to this people.

²²That night Jacob got up and took his two wives, his two female servants and his eleven sons and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³After he had sent them across the stream, he sent over all his possessions. ²⁴So Jacob was left alone, and a man wrestled with him till daybreak. ²⁵When the man saw that he could not overpower him, he touched the socket of Jacob's hip so that his hip was wrenched as he wrestled with the man. ²⁶Then the man said, "Let me go, for it is daybreak."

But Jacob replied, "I will not let you go unless you bless me."

²⁷The man asked him, "What is your name?"

"Jacob," he answered.

²⁸Then the man said, "Your name will no longer be Jacob, but Israel, because you have struggled with God and with humans and have overcome."

²⁹Jacob said, "Please tell me your name."

But he replied, "Why do you ask my name?" Then he blessed him there.

³⁰So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "It is because I saw God face to face, and yet my life was spared."

Children's Devotion


At this time, we invite all our young people to come forward to hear a special message prepared just for them.

¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. ¹⁵And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him.


¹⁴When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.



C: Amen.


