IN GETHSEMANE - THE MOUNT OF OLIVES

When Jesus had finished praying, and they had sung a hymn, he went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples followed him.

Then Jesus told them, "This very night you will all fall away on account of me, for it is written: 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.' But after I have risen, I will go ahead of you into Galilee.


Peter replied, "Even if all fall away on account of you, I never will."

"I tell you the truth," Jesus answered, "today—yes, tonight—before the rooster crows twice you yourself will disown me three times."

But Peter insisted emphatically, "Even if I have to die with you, I will never disown you." And all the others said the same.

Then Jesus went with his disciples and crossed the Kidron Valley. On the other side there was an olive grove, a place called Gethsemane. Jesus and his disciples went into it. Now Judas, who betrayed him, knew the place, because Jesus had often met there with his disciples.

On reaching the place, Jesus said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray. Pray so that you will not fall into temptation." He took Peter, James, and John along with him and he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me." He withdrew about a stone's throw, knelt down, and fell on the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him. "Abba,



Father," he said, "everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will. Not my will, but yours be done."

When he rose from prayer and went back to his disciples, he found them asleep, exhausted from sorrow. "Simon," he said to Peter, "Are you asleep? Could you men not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak."

He went away a second time and prayed, "My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it, may your will be done."

When he came back, he again found them sleeping, because their

eyes were heavy. They did not know what to say to him. So he left them and went away a third time, saying the same thing. An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground.

Returning to the disciples the third time, he said to them, "Are you still sleeping and resting? Look, the hour is near, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us go! Here comes my betrayer!"

While Jesus was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived, guiding a detachment of soldiers and some officials of the chief priests and Pharisees. They were carrying torches, lanterns, and weapons. With him was a large crowd armed with swords and clubs. Judas was leading them.

Jesus, knowing all that was going to happen to him, went out and asked them, "Who is it you want?"

"Jesus of Nazareth," they replied.

"I am he," Jesus said. Judas the traitor was standing there with them. When Jesus said, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground.

Again, he asked them, "Who is it you want?"

And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth."

"I told you that I am he," Jesus answered. "If you are looking for me, then let these men go." This happened so that the words he had spoken would be fulfilled: "I have not lost one of those you gave me."

Now the betrayer had arranged a signal with them. "The one I kiss is the man; arrest him and lead him away." Going at once to Jesus, Judas approached Jesus to kiss him and said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" and kissed him.

Jesus asked him, "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss? Friend do what you came for."

Then the men stepped forward, seized Jesus, and arrested him. When Jesus' followers saw what was going to happen, they said, "Lord, should we strike with our swords?" Simon Peter reached for his sword, drew it out and struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear. The servants name was Malchus.

"No more of this! Put your sword back into its sheath," Jesus said to him, "for all who draw the sword will die by the sword. Shall I not drink the cup my Father has given me to drink? Do you think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels? But how then, would the Scriptures be fulfilled that say it must happen in this way?" And Jesus touched the man's ear and healed him.

At that time Jesus said to the arresting crowd, "Am I leading a rebellion, that you have come out with swords and clubs to capture me? Every day I sat in the temple courts teaching, and you did not lay a hand on me. But this is your hour—when darkness reigns! This has all taken place that the words of the prophets might be fulfilled." All the disciples deserted him and fled.

Children's Devotion

Hymn CW #430 Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted

This Lenten Great was written by Thomas Kelly. Thomas Kelly was born in Ireland in 1769. His father was a judge in the city courts. Thomas also studied law for a time before becoming a pastor in the Church of Ireland. His study of secular law equipped him for a life of preaching God's law. However, his staunch preaching of God's law was met with opposition and he was banned from preaching in the State and Established Churches. He became an independent minister starting new churches around Ireland, places of worship where the Law of God was preached and places of worship where Christ, the fulfillment of Law, was preached.

Thomas Kelly knew, where there was disobedience to God's Law there must be punishment. But he also knew it was Christ, who took the punishment of God's Law upon himself. His hymn, Stricken, Smitten, and Afflicted, calls our attention to "The reality of sin's cost." If we ever are tempted to think lightly of our sin, simply look to the cross of Jesus and see the reality of our sin and its punishment as it was carried out upon Jesus.

When Thomas Kelly was on his death bed, a friend bringing him comfort quoted to him Psalm 23, saying "The Lord is your Shepherd." To which Thomas replied, "The Lord is my everything."

¹The whole Israelite community set out from the Desert of Sin, traveling from place to place as the Lord commanded. They camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. ²So they quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink."




