I deserve your punishment both now and forever.


But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins

First Reading Isaiah 56:1,6-8

The Prophet Isaiah proclaims the day of the Lord's salvation. A time when all people, from every nation, tribe, and race, who come to the Lord in faith will be saved.

¹This is what the Lord says: "Maintain justice and do what is right, for my salvation is close at hand and my righteousness will soon be revealed. ⁶And foreigners who bind themselves to the Lord to minister to him, to love the name of the Lord. and to be his servants, all who keep the Sabbath without desecrating it and who hold fast to my covenant— ⁷these I will bring to my holy mountain and give them joy in my house of prayer. Second Reading Ephesians 2:13-22

Only by faith in Christ do we access to the Father's throne of mercy. It was Christ who kept the law of God perfectly in our place, who gave his life on a cross as our sacrifice for sin, and who through his resurrection declared us to be the forgiven children of God.

¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ.

¹⁴For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, ¹⁵by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations. His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, ¹⁶and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. ¹⁷He came and preached peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near. ¹⁸For through him we both have access to the Father by one Spirit.

¹⁹Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, ²⁰built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. ²¹In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. ²²And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit.

Nicene Creed



Amen.


Lord's Prayer


Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his mercy endures forever.
