First Reading Jeremiah 15:15-21

Even though the troubles and hardships of life may come, the Lord is still a mighty refuge for those who seek him. It was God's Word of promise and comfort that sustained the Prophet Jeremiah, the same Word that guides God's people today.

¹⁵Lord, you understand; remember me and care for me.

Avenge me on my persecutors.

You are long-suffering—do not take me away;

think of how I suffer reproach for your sake.

¹⁶When your words came, I ate them;

they were my joy and my heart's delight,

for I bear your name,

Lord God Almighty.

¹⁷I never sat in the company of revelers,

never made merry with them;

I sat alone because your hand was on me

and you had filled me with indignation.

¹⁸Why is my pain unending

and my wound grievous and incurable?

You are to me like a deceptive brook,

like a spring that fails.

¹⁹Therefore this is what the Lord says:

"If you repent, I will restore you

that you may serve me;

if you utter worthy, not worthless, words,

you will be my spokesman.

Let this people turn to you,

but you must not turn to them.

²⁰I will make you a wall to this people,

a fortified wall of bronze;

they will fight against you

but will not overcome you,

for I am with you

to rescue and save you,"

declares the Lord.

²¹"I will save you from the hands of the wicked and deliver you from the grasp of the cruel."

Second Reading Romans 8:18-25

Even though we may live upon this earth, we still long for the day of the Lord's salvation. The more we see the decay of this world, the more we hope for the greater world to come.

¹⁸I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. ¹⁹For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. ²⁰For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope ²¹that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God.

²²We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. ²³Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently.

How Firm a Foundation

Sermon Matthew 16:21-26

No one wants to suffer, nor do we want to see anyone suffer. When Jesus predicted his suffering and death, the disciple Peter did not want to see Jesus suffer and vowed to stop it from happening. Jesus however, rebuked Peter, for only through his suffering could forgiveness and salvation come to the world.

²¹From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.

²²Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!"

²³Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

²⁴Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ²⁵For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. ²⁶What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?
