C: The light no darkness can overcome.


P: Stay with us Lord, for it is evening. C: And the day is almost over.

### The First Lesson: 1 Chronicles 16:8-13, 34-36

King David had much to be thankful for. The Lord had continuously spared his life, blessed him, and set him on the throne of all Israel. In acknowledgment of the Lord's goodness, King David brings the ark of God to Jerusalem and pitched it in a tent, that the Lord might have a more permanent place of worship and dwelling among the people. King David had this Psalm prepared for the ark's arrival and placement.

Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done. <sup>9</sup>Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts. <sup>10</sup>Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice. <sup>11</sup>Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always.

<sup>12</sup>Remember the wonders he has done,
his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced,
<sup>13</sup>you his servants, the descendants of Israel,
his chosen ones, the children of Jacob.

<sup>34</sup>Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever.
<sup>35</sup>Cry out, "Save us, God our Savior; gather us and deliver us from the nations, that we may give thanks to your holy name, and glory in your praise."
<sup>36</sup>Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting.

## Psalm 30 (Read Responsively)

King David gathered the temple materials, but it would be his son, King Solomon, who would build the temple of the Lord. King David writes a psalm of thanksgiving looking ahead to a time when the temple of the Lord would stand as the place to worship the one true God of faithfulness, power, and mercy.

A psalm. A song. For the dedication of the temple. Of David.

<sup>1</sup> I will exalt you, Lord, for you lifted me out of the depths and did not let my enemies gloat over me.

## <sup>2</sup> Lord my God, I called to you for help, and you healed me.

<sup>3</sup> You, Lord, brought me up from the realm of the dead; you spared me from going down to the pit.

## <sup>4</sup>Sing the praises of the Lord, you his faithful people; praise his holy name.

<sup>5</sup> For his anger lasts only a moment, but his favor lasts a lifetime; weeping may stay for the night, but rejoicing comes in the morning.

## <sup>6</sup> When I felt secure, I said, "I will never be shaken."

<sup>7</sup> Lord, when you favored me, you made my royal mountain stand firm; but when you hid your face, I was dismayed.

## <sup>8</sup> To you, Lord, I called; to the Lord I cried for mercy:

<sup>9</sup> "What is gained if I am silenced, if I go down to the pit? Will the dust praise you? Will it proclaim your faithfulness?

## <sup>10</sup> Hear, Lord, and be merciful to me; Lord, be my help."

<sup>11</sup> You turned my wailing into dancing, you removed my sackcloth and clothed me with joy,

<sup>12</sup> that my heart may sing your praises and not be silent. Lord my God, I will give you thanks forever.

## The Second Lesson: Philippians 4:4-9

As Paul concludes his letter to the Christians in Philippi, he encourages them to let their thanksgiving to God be evident in their life. A Christian's life is a thankful life, not only in praise to God for all his earthly blessings but a life that rejoices in God's eternal blessings of faith, forgiveness, life, and salvation.

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! <sup>5</sup>Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. <sup>6</sup>Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. <sup>7</sup>And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

<sup>8</sup>Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. <sup>9</sup>Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

## **Confession of the 4th Petition and Meaning**

In the Lord's Prayer we pray, "Give us this day our daily bread." This confession and explanation on the 4th Petition reminds us what is meant by "daily bread" and all the daily blessings that come from the Lord to his people.

M: Give us this day our daily bread. *What does this mean?* 

C: God surely gives daily bread without our asking, even to all the wicked, but we pray in this petition that he would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

M: What then is meant by daily bread?

C: Daily bread includes everything that we need for our bodily welfare, such as food and drink, clothing and shoes, house and home, land and cattle, money and goods, a godly spouse, godly children, godly workers, godly and faithful leaders, good government, good weather, peace and order, health, a good name, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

M: This is the Christian's trust and confidence in the Lord that, "My God will meet all your needs" *(Philippians 4:19)* and so, "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good; his love endures forever." *(Psalm 118:1)*

Hear us, Lord, as we give thanks for personal blessings.


## Silent prayer.
